Introduction



Introduction

The end of chapter 3 explains that the Israelites who rebelled against God never entered "his rest" (referring to the Promised Land in 3:18-19). Having shown that Jesus is superior to the great leader Moses, the author turned to another great Israelite leader, Joshua. God's servant Joshua led Israel into the Promised Land, yet he did not provide God's true "rest" (see 4:8). One greater than Joshua accomplished that.

On day seven, God ended His work, rested, and blessed and sanctified [made holy] the seventh day.

² And on the seventh day God ended His work which He had done, and He rested on the seventh day from all His work which He had done. ³ Then God blessed the seventh day and sanctified it, because in it He rested from all His work which God had created and made. (Genesis 2:2-3 NKJV)
