INTRODUCTION



INTRODUCTION

Paul and Silas had been driven out of Thessalonica by their enemies, who then slandered Paul to the young believers in the new church there. This letter answers the accusations of Paul's enemies by describing what the believers already knew the truth of Paul and Silas's message, the sincerity of their motives, and the proof of both by their actions among them. Paul was totally committed to the growth of those who had come to faith through his preaching.
